#### An Introduction to Great Lent

by Fr. Alexander Schmemann

#### Excerpts from Fr Alexander Schmemann's Great Lent

When a man leaves on a journey, he must know where he is going. Thus with Lent. Above all, Lent is a spiritual journey and its destination is Easter, "the Feast of Feasts." It is the preparation for the "fulfillment of Pascha, the true Revelation." We must begin, therefore, by trying to understand this connection between Lent and Easter, for it reveals something very essential, very crucial about our Christian faith and life.

Is it necessary to explain that Easter is much more than one of the feasts, more than a yearly commemoration of a past event? Anyone who has, be it only once, taken part in that night which is "brighter than the day," who has tasted of that unique joy, knows it. [...] On Easter we celebrate Christ's Resurrection as something that happened and still happens to us. For each one of us received the gift of that new life and the power to accept it and live by it. It is a gift which radically alters our attitude toward everything in this world, including death. It makes it possible for us to joyfully affirm: "Death is no more!" Oh, death is still there. to be sure, and we still face it and someday it will come and take us. But it is our whole faith that by His own death Christ changed the very nature of death, made it a passage — a "Passover," a "Pascha" — into the Kingdom of God, transforming the tragedy of tragedies into the ultimate victory. [...]


Such is that faith of the Church, affirmed and made evident by her countless Saints. Is it not our daily experience, however, that this faith is very seldom ours, that all the time we lose and betray the "new life" which we received as a gift, and that in fact we live as if Christ did not rise from the dead, as if that unique event had no meaning whatsoever for us? [...] We simply forget all this — so busy are we, so immersed in our daily preoccupations — and because we forget, we fail. And through this forgetfulness, failure, and sin, our life becomes "old" again - petty, dark, and ultimately meaningless — a meaningless journey toward a meaningless end. [...] We may from time to time acknowledge and confess our various "sins," yet we cease to refer our life to that new life which Christ revealed and

only real sin, the sin of all sins, the bottomless sadness and

If we realize this, then we may understand what Easter is and why it needs and presupposes Lent. For we may then understand that the liturgical traditions of the Church, all its cycles and services, exist, first of all, in order to help us recover the vision and the taste of that new life which we so easily lose and betray, so that we may repent and return to it. [...] And yet the "old" life, that of sin and pettiness, is not easily overcome and changed. The Gospel expects and requires from man an effort of which, in his present state, he is virtually incapable. [...] This is where Great Lent comes in. This is the help extended to us by the Church, the school of repentance which alone will make it possible to receive Easter not as mere permission to eat, to drink, and to relax, but indeed as the end of the "old" in us, as our entrance into the "new." [...] For each year Lent and Easter are, once again, the rediscovery and the recovery by us of what we were made through our own baptismal death and resurrection.

A journey, a pilgrimage! Yet, as we begin it, as we make the first step into the "bright sadness" of Lent, we see — far, far away — the destination. It is the joy of Easter, it is the entrance into the glory of the Kingdom. And it is this vision, the foretaste of Easter, that makes Lent's sadness bright and our Lenten effort a "spiritual spring." The night may be dark and long, but all along the way a mysterious and radiant dawn seems to shine on the horizon. "Do not deprive us of our expectation, O Lover of man!"

The Stewardship Committee has been working very hard to increase the Stewardship of our church. In order for us to be successful, your assistance is needed.

We become members of the Greek Orthodox Church when we receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. We become Stewards when we meet our financial commitment through monetary contributions, individual talents, and by volunteering.

In the beginning of 2021, the Stewardship Committee set a goal to reach 250 Stewards with approximately \$100,000 in pledges.

A campaign to showcase our church and its many ministries, events, and all we have to offer began. This was done by distributing and mailing over 500 Stewardship packets to past, present, and potential new Stewards. Emails and a video were distributed to our community explaining Stewardship and how important it is to be an active Steward of our church. We finished the 2021 year with 238 stewards, just 12 people shy of our goal of 250.

We appreciate all who became Stewards for 2021. We hope that you continue to be a Steward for 2022, along with your family and friends. We urge you to fill out and send in your annual Stewardship pledge card. We invite you to attend our church services, join our many ministries, and contribute your talents to our various committees, thereby becoming an active Steward.

Our goal for 2022 is to reach 300 stewards by the end of December. With faith and assistance, I am certain that we can reach this goal.

## <u>Κυρά Σαρακοστή – Lady Lent</u>

Lady Lent is an old Greek tradition that is held in various parts of Greece, during the Easter period. She comes in the form of a small paper drawing or baked dough and she serves the purpose of an advent calendar, counting down the seven weeks of Lent that lead to Easter.

Her arms are permanently folded in prayer, and the cross on her forehead is a constant reminder of her faith. She has no mouth indicating that she can't eat due to fasting and has seven legs, one for each week of Lent. Every week, starting with the first Saturday of Lent, one of her legs is cut, marking down the weeks to Holy Easter.

In some regions of Greece, the tradition is to hide the last leg inside the Resurrection (Easter) bread. The lucky one who finds this last leg belonging to Kyra Sarakosti is considered blessed.

In other regions of Greece, the seventh leg may be hidden away inside fruit, such as figs, in fruit trees, or fruit bowls.



Lady Lent Kyra Sarakosti, no mouth has she, she neither speaks nor eats.

She has no ears, she does not hear gossip or use idle speech.


Upon her chest, her crossed hands rest, all day Christ she entreats.

And seven feet, no more, no less, has she to count the weeks.

Each Saturday we cut away one of her seven feet.

The last we hide some lace inside some fruit, or nuts, or treats.



I am writing to let you know about a new ministry that we are beginning here at our church. The name of the ministry is *Agape Meals for Kids*.

The concept is simple. For many students here on Long Island, school lunch on Friday is the last meal that they will receive until Monday morning when they return to school. That would be 68 hours of hunger for a child to experience over the weekend every weekend. *Agape Meals for Kids* will give our parish community an opportunity to come together to address some of that urgent need.

We will be delivering food bags containing 7 meals in non-perishable, kid-friendly, easy-to-open packaging to a participating school district with a particularly high need. 
