“And they devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” (Acts 2:42)

And so it was on the day of Pentecost. After the Holy Spirit came down upon the twelve Apostles, appearing as tongues of fire on the heads of each, and when they spoke to the crowd present, each one hearing them in their own language, all who were there were baptized. It was after their baptisms that St. Luke tells us how each of them became devoted to, *“The Apostles’ teaching and fellowship.”* The word devoted is a very strong word. It means that whatever the Apostles were teaching, this would become the most important thing in their life. A person back then would give a certain amount of time, every day, to learn about what the Apostles were teaching. They would make that part of their day solely for learning about Jesus. However, this was only part of their devotion.

The early Church also devoted their time for, *“the breaking of bread and the prayers.”* They devoted time for worship. They gave up time during their day to pray, each and every day. This is what Liturgy is. To devote some time, and to devote a special place to prayer and worship. To focus only on God. To do God’s work. Our work, as God’s people, is to be with Him always. This is done mainly through prayer and good works.

“...we ought to think of God even more often than we draw our breath; and if the expression is permissible, we ought to do nothing else.” St. Gregory Nazianzen (First Theological Oration no. 5) This powerful image of St. Gregory is what total devotion to God is.

Being devoted to God is hard work. It means to wholly commit yourself to Him, to make Him the most important person in your life. To be devoted to God means to let Him guide you and lead you in everything you do in life. When you devote your whole life to God, you come to realize that God is devoted to you. The best way to begin is through prayer. Taking some time out of your day, every day, to spend time with God is important. It reminds us that God is there.

At our Church youth camps, everyday, the campers spend what is called, *“Alone With God.”* Each day the campers stop what they are doing, go off to a private little space, and spend some quiet time being alone. They are told to spend that time talking with God. It can last

anywhere from five minutes to 20 minutes. The children will tell you that this is one of their favorite times of day.

Imagine if, every day, you were able to find a few minutes to spend some quiet time doing nothing but being with God. Instead of “devoting” that entire coffee break to a cup of coffee, take half that time to be only with God. Find a quiet place to be alone and talk to God. Try it for one week and tell me how it felt. I promise you it will feel great. I promise you by the end of the week you will find that it makes you feel better and more energized than the coffee. The more time you spend with God the more time you will want to be with Him. One minute, five minutes, or fifteen minutes a day being with God will be a great comfort to you.

Take the time as well to devote yourself to worship, to the teaching and fellowship of the Apostles. Come and devote yourself to God through the Divine Liturgy. Leave the cares and desires of the world behind and be with others who have the same common devotion as you, and worship together. Be with God together and lift each other up through the prayers and become strengthened through the Cup. Come to Church as often as possible and be where God intended you to be, with Him. Use the Divine Liturgy to inspire and revitalize your spirit so that you can go back into the world confident in the fact that God is always with you, and that you can endure anything with Him. Devote your entire self to God and He will show you the way in all things.

“Worship is the norm of Christian existence. It should be the constant disposition or attitude of the Christian man. Indeed, to worship God means precisely to be aware of His presence, to dwell constantly in this presence. It is through worship that the ‘new man’ is being formed in the believer, and the baptismal grace of adoption is actualized. The Christian man must be always in the state of worship, whether it is expressed in words or not. In its essence worship is the orientation of man towards God.” Protopresbyter Georges Florovsky (1893-1979)

I am writing to let you know about a new ministry that we are beginning here at our church. The name of the ministry is *Agape Meals for Kids*.

The concept is simple. For many students here on Long Island, school lunch on Friday is the last meal that they will receive until Monday morning when they return to school. That would be 68 hours of hunger for a child to experience over the weekend every weekend. *Agape Meals for Kids* will give our parish community an opportunity to come together to address some of that urgent need.

We will be delivering food bags containing 7 meals in non-perishable, kid-friendly, easy-to-open packaging to a participating school district with a particularly high need. These bags will be discreetly distributed by the school staff to those children who have been identified as at risk of weekend hunger and have opted into the ministry program.

Currently we have committed to providing weekend meals to 150 children consistently each week throughout the school year starting on Friday, December 3rd, 2021. We truly believe that this program can be a most rewarding community outreach. We must all become involved by donating food, money to purchase food, sponsoring a child for the school year and by volunteering to pack up the bags and deliver the bags on Friday mornings to the school district we are partnering with.

Let us all come together to show God’s love and a glimpse of hope to hungry children and that our church is a place of Faith, Love and Hope.


