The Kimisis of the Theotokos

The Kimisis, also known as the Dormition or the Falling Asleep of the Theotokos, is a significant event in Orthodox Christianity. This feast commemorates the blessed Virgin Mary's departure from this earthly life and her assumption into heavenly glory. The Kimisis holds immense spiritual significance, representing the culmination of Mary's role as the Mother of God and serves as an inspiration for believers worldwide.

The Nature of the Feast:

The Kimisis is considered a great rejoicing, as it signifies the end of Mary's earthly journey and her entrance into the eternal presence of God. 
His life. It recognizes her role as the Mother of God and her pivotal role in the salvation of humanity.

ets, you will directly contribute to the betterment of our community and help us continue our commitment to promoting our faith and traditions.



ARCHDIOCEASAN DISTRICT CHOIR

After the very exciting experience of singing at the Metropolitan Museum of Art for the Archbishop and guests at the Biennial Conference in New York City last year, we engaged in our District Conference at the Holy Trinity Cathedral in New York City last November, 2022. Since then we had our Vasilopita meeting with the Archbishop at the St. Paraskevi parish.

Some of our members will be participating in the St. Vladimir's Orthodox Summer Music Institute in June themed "Sing to the Lord a New Song: American Orthodox Music: Registration is still available for some auditing and virtual classes as the in person attendance is sold out for this program from June 20 to 24. Acclaimed choral composers and writers will be striving for their compositions to be accepted in American Orthodox musical tradition. Benedict Sheehan was commissioned by St. Michael's Orthodox Church to write a Liturgy, No. 2 for them, which will be performed by the attendees in Louisville, Kentucky on Saturday June 24. Any religious musical composition can be submitted for feedback from faculty and institute instructors.

A General Meeting of the District Council will be held on June 10th, where, among other business, Peggy Stilianos will be sponsoring to formalize a Grant, honoring the spirit and legacy of Spyro Kalos, of blessed memory, former President of the District and Director of the Choir at St. John The Baptist Church in Blue Point and a formally trained and very accomplished musician. He was a frequent contributor to new music, often arranging other works to achieve true byzantine sound.

The Cathedral Choir, both Adult and Childrens Groups, have been invited to attend to His All Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew to perform in Constantinople this July. They will also be performing, by invitation, in the cities of Rhodes and Nisyros as part of their individual Music Festivals. They have also been invited to perform in Athens, by the Ambassador of the United States to Greece.

We are Looking forward to the Conference this year at the Panagia parish of Island Park which will happen in November 10, 11 and 12, 2023. This conference weekend is open to all members of a choir within the Archdiocesan District.



The Greek Orthodox Ladies Philoptochos Society, Inc. is the philanthropic arm of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America that has offered 90 years of philanthropy through a multitude of programs that make a difference in the lives of people in the United States and throughout the world. The Society was established in November 1931, by the late Ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras I, who was then serving as Archbishop of North and South America.

Philoptochos fulfills its mission to "help the poor, the destitute, the hungry, the aged, the sick, the unemployed, the orphaned, the imprisoned, the widowed, those with disabilities and the victims of disasters" through its National and Metropolis Boards and its 26,000 members and more than 400 active chapters, nationwide. Philoptochos responds immediately to needs and crises and its philanthropic outreach extends to each area of the country and throughout the world. In 2019, National Philoptochos distributed \$1.7 million in philanthropic aid.

Since the late 1950's, upon the recommendation of Archbishop Iakovos, Philoptochos has placed an increased emphasis on the implementation of important programs to benefit the Greek Orthodox community, including, but not limited to, institutions of the Church, the philanthropies of the Ecumenical Patriarchate and assistance to Greek and Greek Orthodox families. Involvement in social and moral issues encouraged the establishment of several committees to address topics such as child abuse prevention, domestic violence, homelessness, pornography, drug and alcohol abuse, and aging.
